WILPF Aotearoa is part of the international women's peace organisation established in 1915 to 'bring together women of different political beliefs and philosophies who are united in their determination to study, make known and help abolish the causes and legitimisation of war'.

There are WILPF groups in 49 countries, all working towards the same goals:

- an end to war, violence and coercion
- peaceful negotiated solutions to conflicts
- universal disarmament and the diversion of resources away from armed forces and weapons and towards meeting human need
- the elimination of all forms of inequality, oppression, discrimination and exploitation
- the establishment of an international economic order based on meeting the needs of the people, not on privilege and profit
- environmentally and socially sustainable development
- reforming and strengthening the United Nations to assist with achieving these goals.

Internships

International WILPF offers a range of internships to young women in the areas of disarmament, human rights and NGO management, in the context of the United Nations and other international organizations. The International office in Geneva offers two main internships each year, one for human rights and the other for disarmament.

The WILPF UN Office in New York offers short-term internships for the PeaceWomen and Reaching Critical Will projects, which are available on a rolling basis.
