Letters sent:

 Minister of Foreign Affairs requesting that New Zealand acknowledge Palestine's statehood

- To Government Ministers, Opposition leaders and spokespeople on Gaza asking for support for a permanent ceasefire, for support for South Africa's case at the International Court of Justice
- Minister of Corrections regarding the length of time prisoners spend in solitary confinement
- Minister of Defence regarding the quality of the survey feeding into the Defence Policy Review
- Minister of Immigration regarding changes to immigration policy proposed in the Immigration (Mass Arrivals) Amendment Bill
- Japanese Ambassador regarding release of waters from Fukushima power plant into the Pacific Ocean

We also issued an open letter on the situation in Gaza and a media release on the release of waters from Fukushima power plant into the Pacific Ocean.
